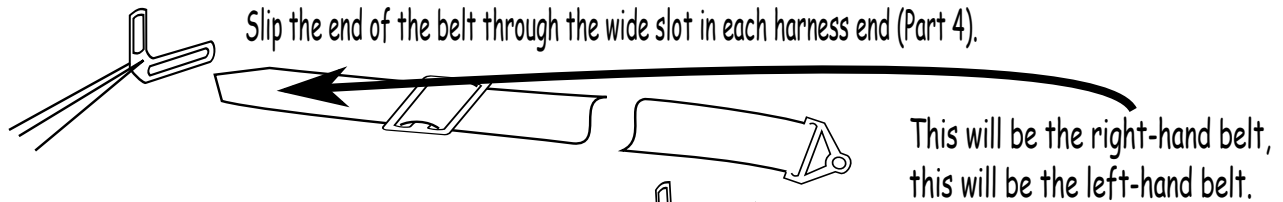
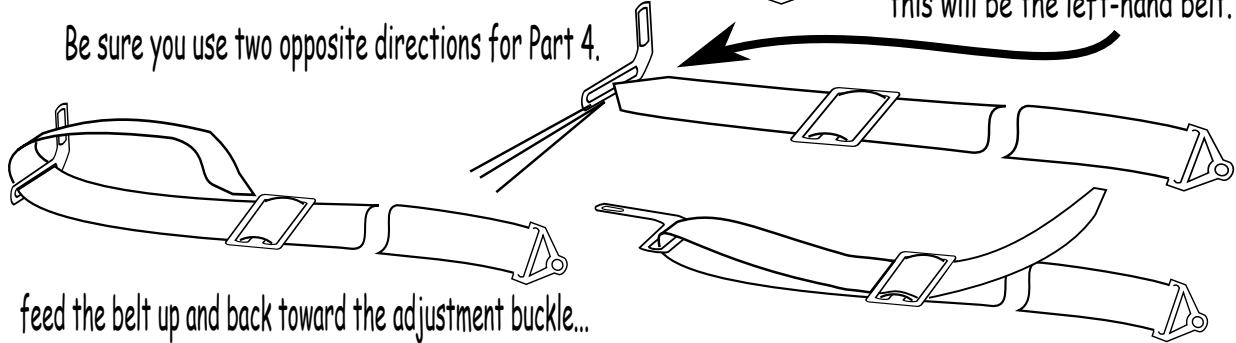


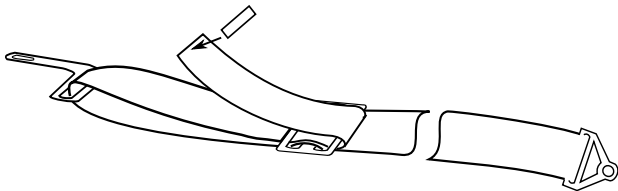
5. Shoulder harnesses. Choose two strips to serve as the shoulder harnesses.



Be sure you use two opposite directions for Part 4.



feed the belt up and back toward the adjustment buckle...

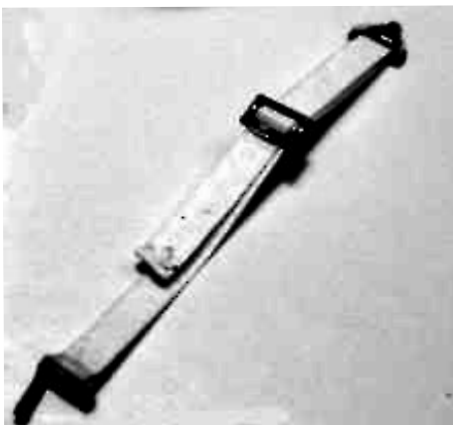
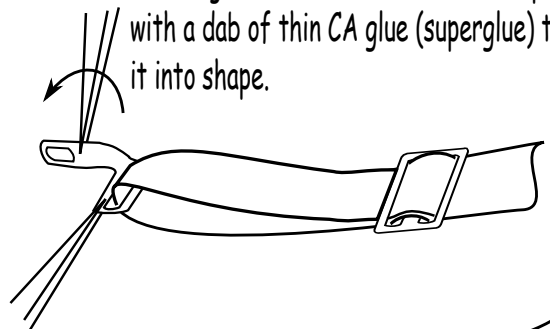


...and carefully loop it back through the adjustment buckle over the top of the other belt paper. If you need to, you can very carefully widen the buckle's slot with the sharp point of your hobby knife.

Now you can bring the paper back down over the buckle, cut to length, and finish with a small paper piece glued to the top of the end to simulate the hem of the belt.

Repeat this process for the opposite belt. You will find that with tweezers and care, you can adjust the length of the harness by working the paper through the end piece and buckle just like the real thing.

Finally, carefully give the end of the harness a 90 degree twist. You can touch the part with a dab of thin CA glue (superglue) to lock it into shape.



6. Use the exact same technique to assemble the tongue end of the lap belt- using Part 2.
